




<p>Week beginning 11.10.21</p>	<p>Over the next few weeks, we will be focusing on the story book Jack Frost by Kazuno Kohara. It's a great wintery themed story with plenty to talk about. You will find activities on this sheet based around this story but feel free to use any other ideas you may have as well. There will also be phonic activities to try each week.</p>
<p>Monday</p> <p>Phonics day</p> <p>Learning letters and their sounds How to teach these sounds in reading and writing</p> 	<p>In Barrowcliff school we use a scheme called Read Write Inc by Ruth Miskin to teach children phonics. Phonic is all about letters and the sounds they make, and how we use this to read and spell words. We normally use lower case letters to do this but it is important for your child to know initials so they can say what their name starts with. Follow the link on Dojo for a short explanation on how we do this in Nursery and how you could help your child practice this week's sound. <p>Tuesday</p> <p>Story Day</p>  <p>Tuning in and listening carefully to stories. Asking and answering questions. Enjoying sharing books and looking at print and pictures</p>	<p>Today I'd like you to listen to our special cold, frosty story Jack Frost by Kazuno Kohara</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=igsDNgU0ed4</p> <p>With your grown up, talk about what happens at the beginning of the story – the trees are bare, there are no leaves, the sky looks icy, the little boy seems sad, why? Why is he indoors? What happens in the middle of the story – the boy meets Jack Frost, what fun games do they play? What happens at the end of the story – what has happened to Jack Frost? Why? Choose another story and find out what happens at the beginning, middle and end.</p>
<p>Wednesday</p> <p>Creative Day</p> <p>Having ideas about what we are learning. How to express these ideas</p>	<p>In the story of Jack Frost, you won't see any warm colours, why do you think this is? Which colours do you think could be cold colours? Find pencils, paints, crayons, felt tips in these cold colours to draw a picture about the story. Maybe you have some silver glitter, old tinsel, or silver foil you could cut up to decorate your picture with icy sparkles. Don't forget to take a picture and show me on Dojo.</p> <p>Mrs Boyes shows you what happens when you mix white paint with another colour on ClassDojo, maybe you would like to try this yourself to see how the colour is altered, and then show her!</p>
<p>Thursday</p> <p>Movement Day</p> <p>Practising large scale movements eg swing arms, jumping, running. Fine motor skills eg using a pencil, scissors.</p>	<p>Today I'd like you to practice holding a pen or pencil. Choose which hand you feel most comfortable using, and grip the pen with 3 fingers. Mrs Boyes shows you this on ClassDojo, you need to sit your pen on your 'comfy' finger, it's much easier to control it. Once you've got the grip, draw, write, colour in, or do all 3!</p> <p>Wrap up warm and spend some time outdoors. You choose how to move – you could walk, hop, jump, skip, ride a bike or scooter.</p>
<p>Friday</p> <p>Maths Day</p>  <p>Developing counting and number skills. Recognising and using numbers. Looking at shape and measurement.</p>	<p>Watch Mrs Boyes singing the song 5 Jolly Snowmen on ClassDojo, you'll soon learn the words and be able to join in. Draw 5 of your own snowmen, you could make them different sizes or all the same. Write a number from 1-5 on each one., lace them in order to sing the song. What happens to the amount each time a snowman melts away.</p> <p>Search around your house to find 5 blue things, 5 red things, 5 green things. When you count them, remember to touch one each time to make sure you find the correct total. Mrs Boyes shows you this on ClassDojo.</p>
