If you want more activities to do at home, look further down the Home Learning page of the website to see ideas from last lockdown. There are also lots of programs on CBBC/CBeebies you can use to support learning at home.

Please remember that children learn lots through play, especially if you can play alongside and/or with them. They will love you reading to them, playing games with them and exploring the outdoors with them.

Reception aged children learn best when they only have to focus for a short period of time e.g. between 5-15 minutes. It is OK for them to have regular play breaks. It is better to stop an activity if it isn't going well and go back to it later rather than battling on and getting stressed.
