



What's The Time Mr Wolf?

Hello again everyone, how are you this week? Did you enjoy last week's rhyming story? This week we have a story and a game to play. We sometimes played this game in Nursery with you, it's called What Time Is It Mr Wolf? It's brilliant for learning about time words and how to tell the time.

- Play the game 'What Time Is It Mr Wolf?' with your family, who will be the wolf? Will the wolf catch you for dinner?
- Listen to the story of What's The Time Mr Wolf. There are many versions, these 2 are my favourites - this one by Debi Gliori - <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=V0chQnVZIQcQ>, and this one by Annie Kubler - <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=r88FICWtoFE>
- You could chant the days of the week, check them on a calendar, what's the day today? Yesterday? Tomorrow? When are special events for your family eg birthdays?
- Look at different clocks, watches, phones, newspapers, on the tv, anything that displays a time
- Make a paper clock. Use a paper plate, or cut out a plate-sized circle. Write the numbers 1-12 on pieces of paper and place in the correct positions. Miss a number out, which number should be there? Which number is opposite 3? Make card hands and attach with a split pin so they turn, move the hands to make o'clock times, what time is it if the minute hand points to 6?
- Draw your face, include eyes, ears, mouth, nose etc. Talk about your face and the clock face. Where do you have hands? Can you find the hour, minute and second hand on the clock?
- Time different events eg food cooking, running races, how long is your favourite tv programme?
- Make a paper wrist watch, find out how here <https://nurturerstore.co.uk/learn-to-tell-the-time-clock-craft>
