



Noah`s Ark

Hiya again everyone,

I hope you`re enjoying all these story activities. This week`s book is taken from **the Bible**. The Bible is a very special book with lots of stories about Jesus and God, maybe you have a Bible at home you could look at. This story is about a man called Noah. God spoke to Noah and told him to do a very important job, to build a boat called an ark. Search on Youtube to find the story of **Noah`s Ark**, there`s lots to choose from. You could join in with the song on Youtube, **The Animals Went In Two By Two** by Helen Doron Song Club.

- Make an **ark** and the animals from lego/ duplo/ building bricks, can you count your animals in the ark in twos?
- Make your own ark from boxes, cartons, paper. Decorate it however you would like to.
- Find different sized boxes, maybe cereal, tissue, biscuit boxes. How many toy animals can you squeeze inside? Can you fit more in one box than another?
- Fill a bowl or bucket with water, collect different items. Which float and which sink? You can even play this game in the bath!
- Make your own boat or ark from empty yogurt pots or milk cartons to float in water.
- Fill a bucket with water, dip in a paintbrush and make marks on the path or wall, can you write your name, letters or numbers know?
- Paint a rainbow or chalk one on the path. It is a **symbol of hope** in the story. Ask your grown up why people have painted rainbows to put in their house windows at the moment.
- Play the `Noah`s Ark Game` - one person can be Noah and cover their eyes, one person hides twigs around the garden (you will find out about twigs or **branches** in the story). `Noah` has to find as many branches as they can.
- Play `Noah`s Ark Memory Game`. Place upto 8 toy animals on a tray, look carefully to remember which are there. Cover the tray with a teatowel and sneakily take one animal away. I wonder if anyone can guess which animal is missing? You might have to give them clues.
- Make a raincatcher with an empty bottle. Follow how to do this with your grown up here <https://classroom.synonym.com/make-rain-catcher-6299284html>

There are lots of other stories from the Bible you could ask your grown up to search for such as `The Good Samaritan`, `The Creation Story` or `The Parable of The Lost Sheep`
