From the Reading & Writing folder:

- Choose a story to read everyday
- Do a Read Write Inc session
- Practise your handwriting - can you find some words you can read yourself around the house and then write them from memory - look at the sheet in your home learning pack for letter formation rhymes
- Read the story again of "The Amazing Adventures of Max" and do the activities on pages 14 - 18 in the booklet. Have fun with the rhyming words.

From the Maths folder:

- Watch a Numberblocks episode
- Do the White Rose maths activities from Summer term - Week 5 folder 'The Princess and the Wizard'
- Sing your favourite number songs
- Try using the Estimation Station sheet to collect items without counting them and see if you can guess how many there are. Who gets the closest answer?
- Practise writing your numbers in words and matching them to the same quantity in digits

From the Science folder:

- Keep adding to your bean diary - How big is your bean? How many leaves/flowers has it got? Draw a picture of what it looks like.
- Using household items and natural objects, which item can carry a toy without sinking? Which is the best/worst boat?

From the Activities folder:

- Can you make a piece of paper into a boat by folding it? This is called origami. Watch the following video to give you an idea
