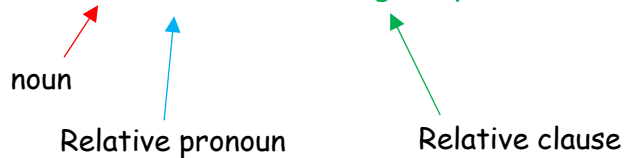


Relative clauses Homework

A **relative clause** gives additional information about a noun. It comes after the **noun** it is referring to (it is its **relative**) and has punctuation around it (commas, brackets, or dashes).

It begins with a relative pronoun - **that, which, who, whose, where, when.**

E.g. The tall **man**, **who was wearing a mysterious hat**, entered the room.



Add a relative clause to these sentences about the **noun**. Make sure you use the correct **relative pronoun**.

1. After break, the **children** came back into class.
2. Once it had been agreed, the **boys** were allowed to play football.
3. The **dog** was sat on the grass outside the **house**.
4. A worm has slithered up the wall and onto the roof.
5. Four rabbits jumped across the stream to their burrows.
